7. Equal Remuneration Act, 1976




World Earth Day

How can we protect our planet?

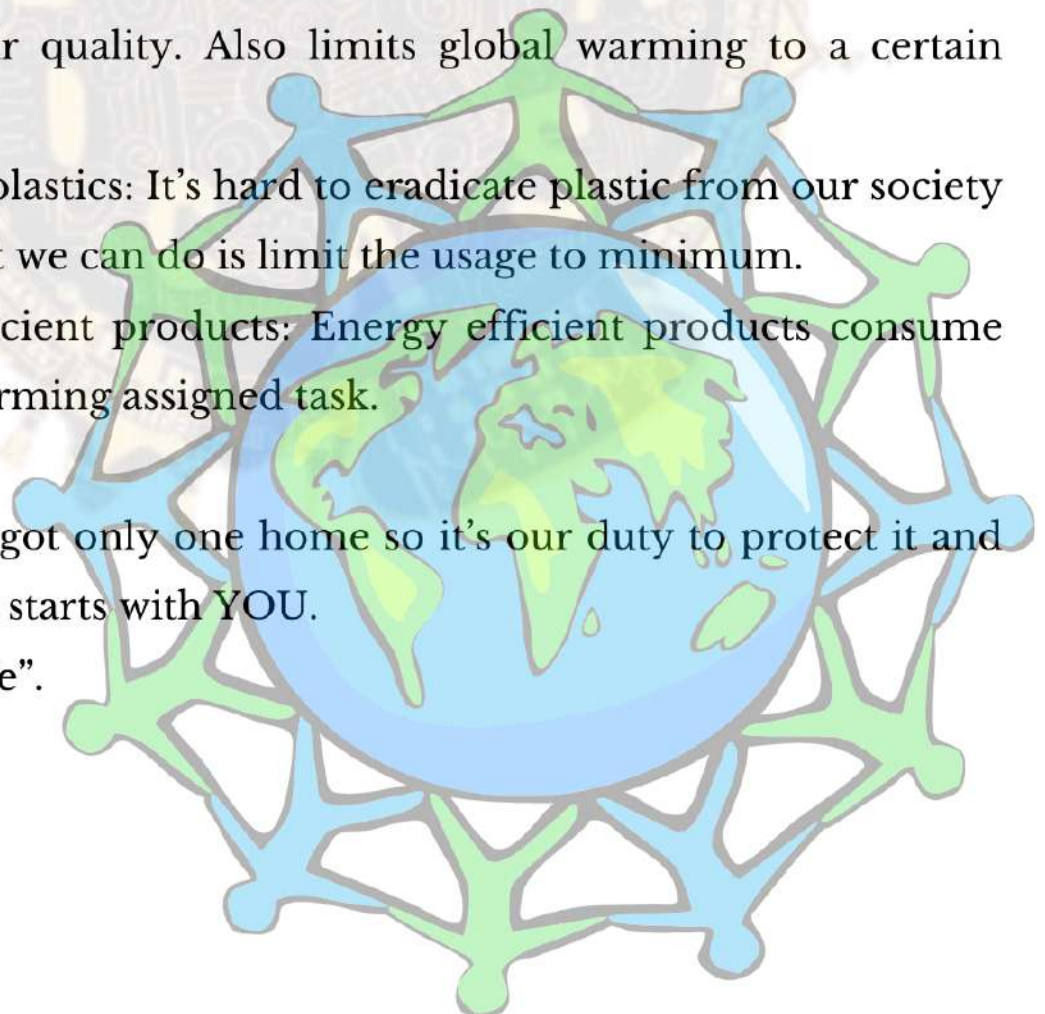
Here are some simple ways which you can adopt in your daily life to preserve our home i.e., “Mother Earth”.
